Priority areas -

- » Prevent Crime:
 - » Reduce victim based crime & repeat victimisation
 - » Tackle ASB
 - » Reduce substance misuse to prevent crime & disorder

» Deliver and effective response:

» Deal effectively with high risk victims of domestic abuse – monitor MARAC referrals

» Reduce harm and risk of harm:

- » Increase confidence in reporting domestic abuse and sexual violence
