- Annual joint working partnership with the FCC Countryside and Environment Service £37,900 (2015/16)
- Halkyn Mountain Ranger £20,000 (2015/16)
- NRW Competitive Grant Fund has resulted in a grant of £37,450 over two years
- FCC Rights of Way Improvement Plan (ROWIP) £37,700 (2015/16)
- Enhancements to the Wales Coast Path are being funded to the amount of £28 000 (2015/16)







- •Responsible for flooding from Main Rivers, Sea and Reservoirs
- •Coastal Erosion Risk Management Authority



Flintshire CC LLFA Role:

- •Lead for managing flood risk from local sources.
- •Responsible for flooding from Ordinary Watercourses, Surface Water and

Groundwater

Environment Bill

Content of the Bill

 A clear legal approach to manage our natural resources in a joined-up way

 Focus on economic and social benefits as well as environmental ones



 Reduce complexity, simplify processes and recognition of the value and opportunities provided by natural resources.

Environment Bill

The Environment Bill is aligned to the Well-being of Future Generations Act (WFG)

- The WFG Act will set national Well-being goals and a duty on public bodies, including NRW &Local Authorities, to maximise their contribution to these goals
- Public bodies will set Well-being objectives to deliver these goals, to be taken forward through the Well-being plans
- The sustainable management of our natural resources is the key contribution by NRW to the delivery of the Well-being goals, objectives and plans
