#### LICENSING COMMITTEE 13<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2019

Minutes of the meeting of the Licensing Committee of Flintshire County Council held at County Hall, Mold on Wednesday, 13<sup>th</sup> February 2019.

#### 14. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

None were received.

#### 15. <u>MINUTES</u>

The minutes of the meeting held on 8<sup>th</sup> November had been circulated with the agenda.

#### **RESOLVED:**

That the minutes be approved as a correct record and signed by the Chair.

#### 16. <u>WELSH GOVERNMENT CONSULTATION: IMPROVING PUBLIC</u> <u>TRANSPORT</u>

The Licensing Team Leader introduced the Welsh Government Consultation: Improving Public Transport report which sought consideration of the draft response to questions 22 to 38 of the consultation.

Welsh Government (WG) had prepared a White Paper, entitled 'Improving Public Transport', setting out changes to how public transport, including taxi services, would be delivered in the future.

The purpose of the consultation was to seek views on the WG legislative proposals for reforming the planning and delivery of local bus services in Wales, together with the licensing of taxis and private hire vehicles (PHV's). The intention of the proposals was to:

- Provide the flexibility to better respond to local public transport needs; and
- Ensure consistency and co-ordination of bus service delivery and a more modern approach to taxi/PHV licensing.

WG indicated that their preferred option constituted implementation of the following four proposals, also known as 'Option A'.

- **Proposal 1:** the standardisation of taxi and PHV standards between the twenty two local authorities in Wales;
- **Proposal 2:** the inability to take enforcement action against vehicles operating 'out of area';
- **Proposal 3:** the difficulty in sharing relevant information in relation to safeguarding; and
- **Proposal 4:** that the existing taxi and PHV licensing functions of the twenty two Welsh local authorities should be redirected to a single national licensing authority. The national authority would be joint transport authority (JTA).

WG had also put forward an 'Option B' for consideration, which would include the implementation of proposals 1-3 above, without proposal 4.

Proposal 1- Questions 22-27 of the consultation addressed the introduction of national standards. The Council was in agreement that the setting of national standards would benefit the current licensing regime, and the response reflected that opinion.

Proposal 2: Questions 28-30 addressed enforcement and the proposal to allow a licensing authority to take enforcement action against any vehicle operating in its area. The Council was in agreement that the power to suspend a vehicle operating in its area where it caused a direct threat to public safety would be welcome, but that any further action should be taken by the home authority. By doing this, the Council would remove the immediate risk to the public and report the matter back to the home authority.

Proposal 3: Questions 31 and 32 addressed information sharing for the purposes of safeguarding, which the Council agreed was critical.

Proposal 4: Questions 33- 38 addressed the WG proposal to redirect all existing taxi functions away from local authorities and into a national licensing authority. The Council did not agree to the proposal. There was no evidence to support the need to redirect the function away from local authorities and there was no detail in the White Paper to explain how the JTA would undertake the licensing function.

Councillor White commented on WG identifying issues with the current regime, such as inconsistent standards across local authorities. The Licensing Team Leader explained that Flintshire standards were high and robust.

In response to a comment from Councillor Chris Dolphin, the Licensing Team Leader said the issue of safeguarding would not be at a cost, it was about not currently having the ability to share information across different local authorities and having a mechanism in place to enable that to happen. Councillor Banks welcomed the report and said the responses outlined were common sense which he hoped WG would listen to.

Members supported the draft response to questions 22-38 of the consultation.

# RESOLVED:

- (a) That the draft response to questions 22-38 of the consultation be supported; and
- (b) That Members did not have anything further they wished to add to the draft response.

#### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

For Members to consider a request made by the Hackney Carriage trade to increase the maximum chargeable fares payable by the public for Hackney Carriage journeys.

2	If any objections are received following the publication of a public notice, Members are asked to consider the delegation of this matter to the Licensing Sub Committee for consideration.

# REPORT DETAILS

1.00	EXPLAINING THE FARE INCREASE
1.01	Section 65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 provides that a district council may fix the maximum rate of fares within the Borough, and all other charges in connection with the hire of a Hackney Carriage vehicle. This is done by means of a table of fares.

4.00	Drivete Lline vehicles are able to act their over famos and therefore are not
1.02	Private Hire vehicles are able to set their own fares and therefore are not the subject of this report.
1.03	Any member of the licensed Hackney Carriage trade may request that a review of fares and charges takes place.
1.04	The Licensing Section have received a request from the Manager at a Private Hire Operator firm which uses a Hackney Carriage vehicle within its fleet. The request cites the cost of living, and rising fuel and insurance costs as the reason for the review.
1.05	The current fares were approved in 2008, and there have been no changes to the fares since that date. The current fares are shown at Appendix A.
1.06	Private Hire and Taxi Monthly magazine publish a monthly table of taxi fares throughout the UK. Flintshire are currently listed at number 334 out of 362 UK wide Local Authorities. The list is shown at Appendix B.
1.07	The proposed fees are shown at Appendix C.
1.08	Licensed Hackney Carriages must be equipped with a taxi meter which must be calibrated to the maximum fares and charges approved by the Council. As the approved fare is a maximum, drivers may charge less if they wish. It is an offence to exceed the approved scale of fares.
1.09	The proposed fees would bring Flintshire in line with the agreed fares within Gwynedd.
1.10	To put the fare increase into perspective, there are currently only four licensed Hackney Carriage vehicles within Flintshire.

2.00	RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS
2.01	There are no implications for Flintshire County Council, however, there are to passengers and proprietors of Hackney Carriage vehicles.

CONSULTATIONS REQUIRED / CARRIED OUT
Local Authorities have a discretionary power to determine Hackney Carriage fares under s.65 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.
When a district council make or vary a table of fares, they shall publish in at least one local newspaper circulating in the district, a notice setting out the table of fares or the variation thereof, and specifying the period, which shall not be less than 14 days from the date of first publication of the notice within which objections to the table of fares or variation can be made.
If no objection to a table of fares or variation is duly made within the period specified in the notice, or if all objections so made are withdrawn, the table
lf no

	of fares or variations shall come into operation on the date of expiration of the period specified in the notice, or the date of withdrawal of the objection or, if more than one, of the last objection, whichever is the later.
3.04	If any objection is duly made, the Council shall set a further date, not more than two months after the specified date on which the table of fares shall come into force with or without modifications as decided by them after consideration of the objections.
3.05	There is no right of appeal against the fares once set.

1.02	The Committee agreed to support the amending of the Private Hire / Hackney Carriage (Joint) Driver, and Private Hire Operator conditions to include the following condition: 'The Driver / Operator must complete a Safeguarding Awareness training course when required to attend by the Licensing Section'					
1.03	Members also supported the proposal that Private Hire / Hackney Carriage (Joint) Drivers who fail to attend the mandatory training will be reported to Licensing Committee.

1.05	To date, 373 drivers and operators have booked themselves onto the training, and most have been in support of this.					
1.06	The training session has now been delivered by NSPCC to members of the licensing team in preparation for the sessions to begin.					
1.07	The Licensing Section will also be supporting the white ribbon campaign, to raise awareness of domestic violence, and will be ensuring every driver and operator is given a white ribbon sticker for their vehicle.					
1.08	The scheme is supported by the Council's Safeguarding Board, and also has the support of North Wales Police.					

1.09	The consultation process for changing the licensing condition has begun. Information was included in all of the safeguarding training letters which went out to all drivers. Further detailed information will be sent out to Private Hire Operators in the coming weeks. Once the condition has been changed, there will be an obligation for every licensed driver to have completed the training.
1.10	For those drivers who do not take advantage of the free sessions, attendance on a safeguarding training course will be chargeable in future. Any refusal will result in the licence holder being brought before a Licensing Sub Committee to ascertain whether they remain fit and proper to remain a licensed driver or operator.

2.00	RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS
2.01	The six sessions have been funded by Flintshire County Council, to ensure that all current licence holders have had the opportunity to attend a session. Future courses will be chargeable.

3.00	CONSULTATIONS REQUIRED / CARRIED OUT
3.01	Consultation has been initiated with all licensed drivers
3.02	Further consultation to be carried out with Private Hire Operators before changing the conditions is actioned.

4.00	RISK MANAGEMENT
4.01	The nature of the role of a Private Hire / Hackney Carriage Driver means they may find themselves on a one to one basis in a vehicle with children or vulnerable adults at any time of the day or night.
4.02	A Private Hire Operator is responsible for taking any bookings for a Private Hire Driver.
