Additional duties placed on Councils and the current demands on services and emergency housing is resulting in additional expenditure and budget pressures, when the Council is already facing significant financial challenges. Whilst some grant is available for 2024-2025 for emergency housing and other discretionary funding, this is not vet confirmed and will not be sufficient to cover the full scale of the financial risk. Capital: Increasing housing supply will require significant capital

investment and has been flagged early within the Council's Capital Programme. The Flintshire Housing Prospectus has been approved by Council and shared with our Housing Partners. Delivery of the Social Housing Grant supports the Council's ambitious plans to increase housing supply at scale and pace. The Transitional Accommodation Capital Programme (TACP) grant regime also supports the purchase and redevelopment of accommodation for the purpose of move on accommodation or additional homeless accommodation.

Human Resources: The Homeless Team has seen a significant amount of staff turnover in recent years. Further recruitment as part of the Housing and Prevention Service restructure is required and is costed through Council Fund and HSG. Levels of sickness and work-related stress is closely monitored within this high demand service. Vicarious trauma because of difficult cases is managed through a range of additional support activities in addition to the Council's Corporate Employee Assistance Programme (Vivup).

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:

Flintshire County Council is committed to sustainability in its own operations as well as across the county more widely through climate change and carbon reduction.

Revenue: The portfolio currently has £89k revenue budget available for

maintaining the existing public conveniences and any additional provision will need to take into account the impact on future revenue budgets for the ongoing cleaning, maintenance and repairs. The current national and local financial position is under increasing pressure and there is little prospect of the portfolio being able to allocate any substantial increase in revenue funding to this nonstatutory service provision; consequently, the ongoing impacts of budget reductions will continue to impose a downward pressure on revenue budgets. When planning the future provision of local toilets, we have to consider the current financial constraints on the service area as well as ongoing future budget reductions. Cleaning and maintenance operations and standards will need to be reviewed on a periodic basis to ensure the most efficient and effective provision within allocated resources.

Capital: There may be implications for the approved capital programme for 2025-2026 and future financial years. The existing toilet facilities are in old structures or standalone facilities, which can make them difficult to maintain and they are in need of significant capital investment, which is limited. Additionally, the Public Health (Wales) Act 2017, as published by Welsh Government, has no funding opportunities for LAs to utilise or additional provisions attached to it. Unfortunately, public toilets can also become a magnet for anti-social behaviour such as drug taking and vandalism, which can impact the provision and cause considerable damage. Any capital or revenue commitment will need to be supported through a business case approach, taking account of full costs and possible income sources.

The Flintshire Housing Prospectus has been approved by Council and shared with our Housing Partners and Social Housing Grant (SHG) supports ambitious plans to increase housing supply at scale and pace.

Human Resources: Staff are under significant pressure with high levels of homelessness. Homeless officer caseloads are increasing at a time when Council Funds are under significant strain.

Finance Officers have been working regionally monitoring the non-risk sharing pooled budget model in place. These discussions have involved all partners' s151 Officers (or equivalent) who agree with the proposed way forward.

The North Wales Regional Leadership Board have received regular updates on the development of the pool fund arrangement.

The proposed agreement has been circulated to each partners' legal

representatives for consideration.

The North Wales Regional Partnership Board, which has strategic oversight responsibilities for partnership arrangements emanating from the 2014 Act must also promote the establishment of pooled funds where appropriate.

Report was considered at Social and Health Care Overview and Scrutiny Committee on 29th February 2024.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:

There are no direct costs associated with signing up to the agreement. The agreement provides the regulatory and governance framework for the establishment of a single, regional pooled fund for North Wales for a period of three years. The arrangement will comprise of each partner organisation providing contributions to the pooled fund equivalent to the costs they incur. There will therefore be no risk sharing in the first year of this arrangement or any crosssubsidisation between the partners.

Denbighshire County Council will act as Host Authority for the regional pooled fund for the period of the agreement. The hosting arrangements will, in line with the terms of the legal agreement, be reviewed by the partners as part of the development of the pooled fund arrangements for future financial years.

A contribution from regionally administered transformation funding of £20k is paid to Denbighshire to recognise the cost of hosting the pool on behalf of all partners.

The establishment of a formal Section 33 agreement would have significant resource implications for the host agency.

A National Corporate Parenting Implementation Group, comprising local authorities, as well as Voices from Care Cymru, the Children's Commissioner's office, the National Youth Advocacy Service, Children in Wales, National Adoption Service, and Public Health Wales was established in 2019. The Group played a key role in developing the national Charter.

In Flintshire we will work with care experienced children and young people to agree a set of principles for how we can deliver and monitor compliance with the Charter. Our care experienced children and young people will be central to this work.

RESOURCE IMPLICATIONS:

The Charter takes into account legislative duties set out in the Social Services and Well-being (Wales) Act 2014. The

expectations and requirements of the Charter are consistent with our existing approach to Corporate Parenting.

Welsh Government are in the process of considering the development of guidance to support implementation of the Charter as well as including a dedicated chapter on Corporate Parenting within the Part 6 Code of Practice (Looked after and accommodated children) under the Social Services and Well-being (Wales) Act 2014.
