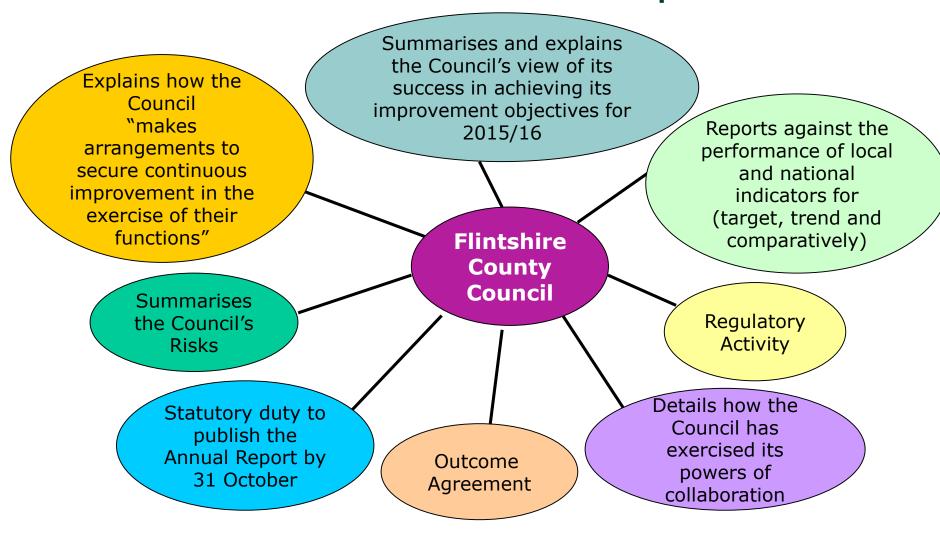


#### **This Presentation**

### Highlights

#### » Some of our Highlights include:

#### » Housing / Poverty

- » Homes receiving energy efficient measures
  - > i) Council Homes: increased from 417 to 649;
  - > ii) Non Council homes from 422 to 593.
- » Exceeded majority of the targets and promises made within the Tenants' Choices document (e.g. kitchen replacements)

#### » Living Well

- » Referrals for re-ablement improved from 78% in 2014/15 to 85% in 2015/16
- » Dementia awareness programme including 6 memory cafes established
- » Adult referrals and child protection reviews improvements

#### » Economy and Enterprise

- » 2,139 jobs created; 863 within the Deeside Enterprise Zone (exceeding overall target of 5,000 jobs 2012-17 by 1,500)
- » Existing businesses 917 new jobs created
- » Visitor numbers increased by 6.8% to 3.38 million; economic impact increased to £220M



### Highlights continued

#### » Skills and Learning

- » Foundation phase and KS2 steady improvements; KS3 above Wales average
- » Key milestones for 21 Century Schools and School Modernisation met
- » 12 new apprenticeship placements created as a result of WHQS and SHARP contracts
- » Continuation of securing high levels (98.7%) of 16 year olds in education, employment or training
- » Young people above school age in the Youth Justice Service offered 25 hours of education, training or employment increased from 43% to 75%

#### » Environment / Safe communities

- » Quality of road conditions
- » Community safety initiatives

#### » Modern and Efficient Council

- » 5 new social enterprises developed through Community Asset Transfer programme
- » 8 Community Asset transfers completed or in final stages of legal completion



### Areas for Improvement

#### » Areas for ongoing improvement include:

- » Calendar days to deliver a disabled facilities grant for adults and children (improvements made in 2015/16; and continuing)
- » Speed of processing housing benefit claims
- » Educational success of learners impacted by poverty and disadvantage

## » National Performance Bulletin (Local Government Data Unit)

- » Published 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2016
- » Contains data on a range of local authority services and enables performance comparison on a national level
- » Did not contain any surprises for Flintshire



### Performance Overview

- » Overall performance summary
  - Improvement Plan Measures:
    - Trend (where comparison could be undertaken),
      - 63% (62) Improved, 4% (4) Maintained and 32% (33)
         Downturned
    - Target:
      - met or exceeded target in 67% (59), target missed but within an acceptable margin 17% (19) and significantly missed 24% (27)
  - National rankings:
    - Nationally 60% (24) of our indicators are in top and upper middle quarters
    - Of the 22 Authorities across Wales Flintshire is in the top 10 (8<sup>th</sup>) to show improvement between (2014/15) and (2015/16)
  - Indicators are only part of the picture



### Wales Audit Office – 2015/16 view

#### » Annual Improvement Report published June 2016

- » "Despite increasing budget pressures the Council continues to make good progress against its priority areas and maintains compliance with the Local Government Measure 2009;
- » The Council's performance [in 2014/15] relative to other councils in Wales improved significantly.
- The proportion of indicators where performance was better than the national average improved from 51% in 2013-14 to 62% in 2014-15 and a higher proportion of national indicators were in the top half – 60 per cent in 2014-15 compared to 54 per cent in 2013-14."



### Overview

#### **Performance indicators:**

- Recognition of areas for improvement identified for scrutiny and challenge – ongoing into future plan 2017+
- Comparisons may mislead: ongoing improvement is what we strive for

#### Improvement priorities:

Report includes an overall self assessment of achievement of the Council's 8 Improvement Priorities:

- Progress: 2 Amber and 6 Green
- Outcome: 2 Amber and 6 Green
