EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Local Democracy & Boundary Commission for Wales has published its draft proposals for Flintshire.

The Commission has proposed changes to the arrangement of local electoral wards to make a step towards achieving electoral parity across the County.

The Commission proposes a council of 65 members. This would be a reduction from the current size of 70 and would achieve an average ratio of 1,836 electors to each member.

The proposals are published per public consultation.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1 That Council advises what process it would like to follow to prepare and approve a response before the end of November.

REPORT DETAILS

1.00	THE LOCAL DEMOCRACY & BOUNDARY COMMISSION PROPSALS FOR FLINTSHIRE
1.01	The Local Democracy & Boundary Commission for Wales has published its Review of the Electoral Arrangements for the County of Flintshire which sets out its draft proposals for our local electoral wards.
1.02	The initial consultation process took place between November 2018 and January 2019. The Commission had indicated at that time that Flintshire should have a Councillor/electorate ratio of 1:1,895. We currently have electorates of between 1,041 and 4,582.
1.03	During the consultation period we held extensive discussions with Members, including two workshops, a series of drop-in sessions and individual and group discussions, before drafting a response. The County Council approved a response at our meeting on 29 th January.
1.04	Members worked together to make proposals to the Commission for changes which would improve local representation. It was noted that Members representing rural areas had raised concerns that the size and topography of a ward is not taken into account by the Commission in balancing the ratio requirement with the logistics of local representation.
1.05	The Commission received representations from the County Council, 10 town and community councils, 14 county councillors, 6 town and community councillors, the Alyn and Deeside Conservative Association, Bagillt Labour Party and 6 members of the public. The Commission considered the representations before it formulated its own proposals. A summary of these representations can be found at Appendix 5 of the Draft Proposals report (attached).
1.06	The Commission has proposed a change to the arrangement of our electoral wards to achieve what it believes will be "a significant improvement" in the level of electoral parity across the County of Flintshire.
	 The Commission has proposed a Council of 65 members - a reduction from the current size of 70. This would result in a proposed county average ratio of 1,836 electors per member.
	 The Commission has proposed 39 electoral wards - a reduction from the 57 existing wards.
	The proposed new wards show less variation from the target ratio of members to electors from the current.

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7.00	GLOSSARY OF TERMS
7.01	Local Democracy and Boundary Commission for Wales: The role of the Commission is to keep under review all local government areas in Wales, and the electoral arrangements for the principal areas, and to make such proposals to the Welsh Government as seem desirable in the interests of effective and convenient local government.
	Local Government (Democracy) Wales Act 2013: An Act of the National Assembly for Wales to make provision about the constitution and functions of the Local Democracy and Boundary Commission for Wales; to make various provisions relating to local government; and for connected purposes.
	Electoral Review: A review of electoral arrangements for a local authority area.
	Council Size Methodology: A model the Commission has adopted for determining the size of Councils.
	Assessment: The programme is based upon the base data in the assessment table but moving principal councils up or down the order to take into consideration the former Cabinet Secretary's desire for review of certain councils to be undertaken first.
