Removal of the Universal Credit Uplift

That this Council supports the calls for the UK Government to reinstate the £20 per week enhancement to Universal Credit and to extend this support to legacy benefits. This council also expresses its deep regret that the UK government did not apply this uplift to legacy benefits during the pandemic. The council recognises and welcomes the changes made to Universal Credit in the budget especially to the taper rate but expresses its concern that this will not impact people unable to work or legacy benefit claimants.

Council calls on the Leader to write to our two local Members of Parliament to invite their support for this motion.

Local Electricity Bill

- 1) producers to sell electricity locally without going through the wholesale market and therefore having more control over the price; or
