The action plan for the self-assessment is detailed in Appendix A.

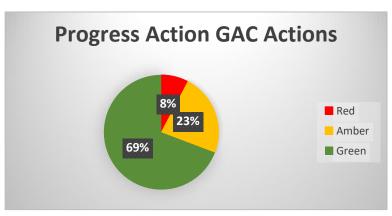

1.00	EXPLAINING THE GOVERNANCE AND AUDIT COMMITTEE SELF ASSESSMENT ACTION PLAN
1.01	In February 2024, the self-assessment was completed, and a report presented to the Governance and Audit Committee in April 2024.
	At the meeting it was agreed that a mid-year review of the action plan should be brought back to committee.
	Overall positive progress has been made. Out of the 13 actions progress raised only one has not progressed:
	Seek feedback from Chairs of Scrutiny on co-working arrangements to ensure good communications and complementary approaches to improvement. Establish ongoing comms system between GAC Chair and Chairs of Scrutiny. To address this, Individual meetings to be

established between the Chair and Vice Chair of GAC and each OSC with the aim of improving relationships and understanding of each other's role. This is due to be arranged in January 2025.

It is founded on the basic principles of openness and inclusivity, integrity and accountability together with the overarching concept of leadership. It is an inter-related system that brings together the underlying set of legislative requirements, governance principles and management processes.
