Context...

- » **Continues to be a statutory requirement under Crime and Disorder Act 1998 to have a CSP**
- » **Strategies in place to address:**
 - › Crime and disorder
 - › Substance misuse
 - › Reoffending
- » **Requirement to have a CSP Chair**
- » **Commissioning requirements**
- » **Undertake Domestic Homicide Reviews**
- » **Governance arrangements – delegation to Public Services Board**

Community Safety Delivery Groups

A leaner structure.....

- » **People are Safe Board (Strategic)**
- » **Operational Groups**
 - CDRP & VARM Tasking
 - Visible Vulnerable Group
 - Integrated Offender Management Group (IOM)
 - MARAC Task and Finish Groups, e.g. White Ribbon Group
- » **Changing the way we work together, but still making a difference!**

Local priorities for 2021/22 – Priority 1

- » **Priority 1: Violence Against Women, Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence**
 - Raise people's confidence to report appropriately to partners.
 - Recognition of the signs and symptoms of domestic abuse and sexual violence by public and voluntary sector agencies.
 - Improved response from public services to Violence Against Women, Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence (VAWDASV) should see an increase in reporting as individuals will be confident in coming forward.



Local priorities for 2021/22 – Priority 2

» Priority 2: Protecting Vulnerable Adults

- Vulnerable adults prevented from becoming victims of crime
- Substance misuse tackled collaboratively on a local and regional level
- Awareness of the impacts of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) amongst partners through the life course
- Committed regional partnership approach to addressing crime and disorder continued
- Better sharing of intelligence across partner agencies
- Increased partnership action to tackle Organised Crime Gangs



Local priorities for 2021/22 – Priorities 3 & 4

» **Priority 3: Protecting Vulnerable Young People**

- Awareness of the impacts of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) amongst partners.
- Partnership action to tackle Child Sexual Exploitation.
- Vulnerable young people prevented from becoming victims of crime.

» **Priority 4: Protecting Our Communities**

- Respond appropriately to intelligence gathered from our communities.
- Identify and deter those individuals who could cause our communities the most harm.
